Like Breast Cancer Awareness Month, Cervical Health Awareness Month presents many opportunities to educate women about prevention, early detection, and treatment of cervical cancer. This year proved no different. Events during January included Lunch & Learns, Health Fairs, and Free Screening Clinics. To keep things interesting, most of the events included food, door prizes, additional screening tests (such as body mass index analysis), and educational information. During January, February, and March alone, 304 women were screened at twenty Free Screening Clinics. Of the women screened, 201 were WVBCCSP eligible.
