#### What is the West Virginia Breast and Cervical Cancer Screening Program?

A program that offers **FREE** Pap tests, mammograms, and clinical breast exams for women who qualify.

#### Why are these exams important?

They check for breast and cervical cancer. When found early, cancer is easier to treat and your chance of survival greatly improves.

#### What is the cost?

Services provided by the West Virginia Breast and Cervical Cancer Screening Program are **FREE** for women who qualify.



#### Who can get these **FREE** services?

Women who...

- Are between the age 25 - 64 (**FREE** Pap test and clinical breast exam)
- Are between the age 50 - 64 (**FREE** mammogram)
- Have no health insurance, are underinsured or have high deductibles
- Have low incomes

### Did You Know?

**1 in 8** women will be diagnosed with breast cancer and **1 in 33** will die from the disease.

The screening test for cervical cancer is called the Pap test.

Nearly all cases of invasive cervical cancer can be prevented if a woman is screened regularly.

Early stages of cancer usually have no symptoms. That's why it is important to be screened regularly.
