NURSING FACILITY SERVICES

17.13 BENEFIT REPAYMENT

A. RECIPIENT REPAYMENT

When payment for nursing care services is made for a recipient who is ineligible for such payment, or for a lower amount, or for Medicaid, repayment is pursued as specified i Chapter 20.

B. PROVIDER FRAUD

When fraud on the part of a nursing facility or other Medicaid provider is suspected, the procedures in Chapter 20 are followed.

C. ESTATE RECOVERY

Effective June 9, 1995, West Virginia has the authority to place liens on the estate or property of a Medicaid recipien who is either in a nursing facility or who receives benefits under the Home and Community Based Waiver program, and who i aged 55 or older, or who is determined permanently institutionalized. The amount of the lien only considers benefits received after June 9, 1995. These liens cannot force the sale of real property during a person's lifetime.

The Bureau for Medical Services is responsible for implementing this law and has hired a contract agency to accomplish the recovery and to answer questions from interested persons. When the Worker receives inquiries abou Estate Recovery, the individual must be referred to the contract agency at 1-888-378-2836. The Worker must not contact the contract agency on behalf of the client, but mus refer the client or his representative to the contract agency.

See Section 17.2 for procedures in the application process t explain the applicability of Estate Recovery. The OSF-LTC-4 is used for this purpose, but completion of the form is not an eligibility requirement.
