If you are using Occupational Therapy Assistants, with the family's permission, to provide intervention – please let the other team members know the name and contact information for that Occupational Therapy Assistant.

There have been situations recently where the team was surprised to find out from a family that a Occupational Therapy Assistant was to serve the child not the selected Occupational Therapist. The conversation about the use of a COTA did not occur as part of the IFSP meeting as it should. A quick email, text or note in BTT Online would be greatly appreciated. We know you value your team members and would not intentionally place them in an awkward position.
