Each eligible child will have a family education plan called an Individualized Family Service Plan (IFSP) and each family will have a Service Coordinator who will help you coordinate services.

Early intervention services can be provided anywhere in the community where your child typically spends their day, including:

- Your home.
- A child care center or family day care home.
- Community/recreational centers, play groups, playgrounds, libraries, early childhood programs and centers, such as Early Head Start.



All services are provided at no cost to the family, regardless of income, and are voluntary on the part of the family.

What is WV Birth to Three?

WV Birth to Three provides families with the information and skills they need to help their child be successful.

WV Birth to Three can:

- Support your family in identifying your child and family's strengths and needs.
- Assist your family in learning how to teach your child new behaviors and skills.
- Link your family to other community programs/services that can help you in meeting the needs of your family.

Who is eligible for WV Birth to Three?

Any child in West Virginia between the ages of birth through 35 months may be eligible if the child is:

- Not reaching age-appropriate milestones in one or more areas of development.
- At risk for developmental delay.
- Diagnosed with a condition that may result in developmental delay.

Children learn best during the day-today routines and activities of their family.

Infants and toddlers learn through practicing skills all day long—at mealtime, bath time, play time, even as you go to the store.

If eligible, the WV Birth to Three team will coach your family in how to support your child's development and participation in the daily routines and activities of the family.

The WV Birth to Three team might include a speech therapist, nutritionist, physical therapist, or another professional. The team membership and how often they support your family is based on the unique needs of your child and family.
