Hello! You are being invited to participate in a research survey regarding the perception of mobility as a human right.

The purpose of this research is to assess student, parent, and early intervention practitioner opinions regarding if mobility is a human right. Your participation would involve responding to an online survey, which should take roughly 5-10 minutes to complete.

At this time, there is only one round of data collection needed participation. Your responses will be confidential, with no identifiable information being recorded with the survey other than the population group you are a member of (student, parent, or practitioner). Your responses will be converted into a digital data group set that will be saved digitally and kept for about a year for review.

The survey will be open and available March 28 to April 29, 2022.

We do believe that the benefit of this survey will help guide education of healthcare practitioners working with children with limited mobility. This information could provide guidance for work towards insurance coverage of assistive technology to assist mobility in this population as well. We do not foresee any risks of participating in this research other than possible emotional stress when debating whether mobility is a human right.
