New Infant-Toddler Curriculum Approved

The Program for Infant/Toddler Care (PITC) curriculum has been approved by the WV Tiered Reimbursement Program. This curriculum is for use with 0-3 age groups in both family childcare settings and center-based programs. It can be used as a primary curriculum or as a supplement. If you have participated in WVIT, Great Beginnings or other activities facilitated by the Infant/Toddler Specialist Network then you are familiar with PITC program philosophies and are now eligible for an opportunity to participate in the pilot roll-out of the PITC curriculum.

Below is a sampling of what will be offered:

- A complete copy of the PITC Curriculum valued at \$350 for each participating classroom.
- WV STARS registered technical assistance throughout the pilot
- Personal stipend for enrolled participants
- Bonus award for the program upon completion

Requirements for participation:

- Must have a current Provider Service Agreement
- Must attend Great Beginnings 2022 for the kick-off
- Must commit to at least 6 months of coaching, TA, & training
- Must have completed WVIT or be enrolled in an upcoming class (ACDS semesters 1 & 2 after 2018 can be substituted).

Online Professional Development Policies

- You must register for each training in WV STARS and on the registration links provided
- Each participant must individually register and log in to the training to receive credit. Device/screen sharing is not permitted for WV STARS credit.
- Participants who call in to the training by phone without also logging in to a computer, smartphone, or tablet will not receive credit, as this type of attendance cannot be tracked.
- Participants who miss more than 15 minutes of a session or do not meet minimum proof of learning/participation requirements will not receive credit for attending.
- All participants are expected to remain active in each session by participating in polls, discussions, post-tests, etc.
- Any technical issues that occur during the session should be communicated with the trainer as soon as possible so they can be resolved.

In-Person Professional Development Policies

Food and Fun

Fall Tree Snack

Ingredients: Pretzel sticks (long and short), paper plate, Apple Jacks cereal

Directions: Give children each a paper plate. Give each child 2 long pretzel rods for the trunk of the tree, and about 12 small pretzel rods for the branches. Allow them to create their own tree, then give each child Apple Jacks cereal to add in for fall colored leaves to the top of the tree.



Autumn Leaf Bugs

Materials: Leaves, small rocks, stems, flowers, sticks, pinecones, Directions: Have children do a nature hunt outside your program or ask children to bring nature items from home to get a variety. Place leaves, sticks, rocks, flowers, stems, etc. in vour sensorv area. Discuss with children what type of bugs they may see in our area during Autumn. Let children create their own bugs out of the nature supplies. If children want to save their bugs, glue the pieces on cardstock with liquid glue. Allow adequate time to dry before moving the finished product. Directions: Make a bucket list

Corn on the Cob Painting

Materials: Corn cobs, paint, paintbrushes, paper

Directions: Using several colors of paint allow children to use a paintbrush and paint several colors of paint on an ear of corn. When children are finished painting their corn have them roll their corn on the cob on a piece of paper to show different textures and colors.
