

#### **Online Professional Development Policies**

- You must register for each training in WV STARS and on the registration links provided.
- Each participant must individually register and log in to the training to receive credit. Device/screen sharing is not permitted for WV STARS credit.
- Participants who call in to the training by phone without also logging in to a computer, smartphone, or tablet will not receive credit, as this type of attendance cannot be tracked.
- Participants who miss more than 15 minutes of a session or do not meet minimum proof of learning/participation requirements will not receive credit for attending.
- All participants are expected to remain active in each session by participating in polls, discussions, posttests, etc and not navigating away from the webinar on their screen.
- Any technical issues that occur during the session should be communicated with the trainer as soon as possible so they can be resolved.

### Food and Fun

#### Paper Bag Kite

Materials: Paper bag, yarn/twine/ string, popsicle sticks, scissors, streamers, colored tape, variety of decorating materials: stickers, paint, markers, stamps, glue, paper, etc.

Directions: Begin by having children decorate their paper bag. Give them a variety of materials to choose from. If children use paint or glue, be sure it is dry before the next step. Cut a small hole in the bottom of the bag for the kite string. Cut a piece of string about 18 inches long and tie one end to the middle of a popsicle stick. Feed the other end through the hole in the bag. Attach streamers to the open end of the bag using tape. Let children fly their creations!



#### **Flower Painting**

*Materials:* Flowers with stems attached, paint, paper

Directions: Allow children to pick flowers from around your program or let them bring one from home. Prompt children to use the flower like a paintbrush. Children can make flower prints or brush the paper with the flower to create their own texture. Provide many different colors for them to use. Use this time to talk about what they think the texture will be like and how different flowers create different prints.



#### Caterpillar Banana Snack

Ingredients: A banana, various sprinkles (including two black sprinkles for the eyes), pretzel sticks

Directions: Carefully slice the banana and arrange slices into the caterpillar shape. Decorate the body with sprinkles and use two black sprinkles to make the eyes. Break the pretzel sticks in half and stick them in the head to make the antennae. If you like, use additional pretzel sticks to make legs!
