#### Behavior Consultant Corner

At some point in time, almost everyone will encounter a child that "just won't listen." I frequently see this situation, often accompanied by a frazzled parent, teacher, or provider. It is sometimes difficult to see the light at the end of the tunnel, but here are some techniques to try that will help shape this child into a good listener. First, explain that everyone's thoughts and feelings are important and that everyone will get a chance to share. Second, try a listening game in which you ask the child questions about a story that you read, or to comment on something that you said...this is also a great way to build conversation skills! Lastly, make "No Interruptions" a family or school rule. Try a role playing game during which everyone talks at once. This allows everyone to see how difficult it is if people don't take the time to listen to each other. Implementing these suggestions may take a little time, but with consistency and gentle persistence, you will be well on your way to building and enhancing good

# Components of Quality Care and Education Modules

Components of Quality Care and Education Modules trainings are being offered by Link CCR&R beginning May 1, 2007 at the Hamlin



Library, Lincoln County. This training unit is an eight week course that runs consecutively over eight Tuesdays from 9:30am- 2:00pm. The class dates are May 1, 8, 15, 22, 29, June 5, 12, 19. The trainings are for providers working with children ages 2 1/2-5 years of age. Providers will receive thirty-two (32) hours of professional development for successfully completing the entire eight week course, as well as resources to use in their early childhood program.


A requirement of these training modules is a pre-and post-on-site visit by the Training Specialist with each provider enrolled in the training.

Registration Deadline is Friday, April 6. Participants need to attend all scheduled sessions. Providers must be on the participant list in order to attend these sessions. No walk in or stand by participants will be accepted and there will be no waiting list for individual sessions. - \*You may not bring children to any Link training session.
- \*You must bring a picture ID to all Trainings.
- \*You must arrive at the scheduled time. Late arrivals may not receive training credit.
