conference.



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New West Virginia Core Competencies

On January 1, 2005 the new WV Core Knowledge and Core Competencies went into place. As you will see on our training calendar on pages 4 & 5, the new core competencies are listed with each training.

Core Knowledge Areas provide an overview of essential knowledge that all early care and education professionals should know and understand. The eight Core Knowledge content areas are:

Child Growth and Development Positive Interactions and Relationships Child Observation and Assessment Program Management



Health, Safety and Nutrition Curriculum Family And Community Professionalism

The core competency areas are designed into three tiers that establish a continuum of learning from entry level skills to an advanced level of academic preparation and varied experience. Each tier encompasses the knowledge base and competencies of the previous level. Individuals progress from one tier to another through a combination of formal study and experience. Tier 1 competencies are intentionally written in clear, specific language to support beginning levels. Tiers are listed on the certificates providers receive when completing Link Training Sessions. 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Behavior Support Specialist

Let's talk about horses just a moment. Last time I traveled through Lexington, Kentucky, I was struck by the fact that so many horses live so much better than so many people. Now, some will smugly proclaim such people choose, or deserve, to live that way. Do their children? What a world! While we're on the subject; I recently spoke to a horse trainer. Our conversation went something like this:

ME: How do you teach a horse skills?

TRAINER: Well, when the horse first arrives, we just get acquainted. I'll brush it, groom it, talk to it, feed it, let it run in the lot, you know, make it feel comfortable. Next, I start working the horse. Let's say I'm teaching it to back up. I'll work with it until it takes a step back. Then I give it a reward and stop for the

day.

ME: Why do you stop?

TRAINER: I want our interaction to stop on a positive note. Next day, same thing. I'll push a little harder, but not to the point of frustrating or scaring the horse, and I'll stop on a positive note. I've had a lot of success doing it like that.

ME: Do you ever hit the horse, you know whip it to make it mind?


TRAINER: That's a good way to ruin a horse.

ME: Oh, Hmm.

His comments have been with me constantly since our conversation,

and it goes without saying it caused me to think. (Not of horses, but of children.)



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Training Calendar

Family Child Care Providers must complete First Aid and CPR training within six (6) months of registration. First Aid and CPR count toward the health and safety required training hours. Two (2) hours of health or safety training plus an additional six (6) hours of training in three (3) other core competency (type of training—see list on right) areas are required each year according to the date on each individuals certificate of registration.

You may not bring children to any of the training sessions.

You must bring a picture ID to all Trainings.
