Attached is a copy of the findings of fact and conclusions of law on your hearing held March 8, 2006. Your hearing request was based on the Department of Health and Human Resources' action to deny services under the Aged/Disabled Home and Community Based Services Waiver (ADW) Program.

In arriving at a decision, the State Hearing Officer is governed by the Public Welfare Laws of West Virginia and the rules and regulations established by the Department of Health and Human Resources. These same laws and regulations are used in all cases to assure that all persons are treated alike.

Eligibility for the Aged/Disabled Home and Community Based Services Waiver (ADW) Program is based on current policy and regulations. Some of these regulations state as follows: An individual must have five deficits on the PAS to qualify medically for the ADW Program. These deficits are derived from a combination of assessment elements on the PAS. (Section 570.1.b of the Medicaid Aged & Disabled Waiver Program Policies & Procedures Manual effective November 1, 2003)

The information which was submitted at your hearing revealed that you do not meet the medical criteria for the ADW Program.

It is the decision of the State Hearing Officer to uphold the action of the Department to deny services under the Aged/Disabled Home and Community Based Services Waiver (ADW) Program.

DECISION OF STATE HEARING OFFICER

I. INTRODUCTION:

This is a report of the State Hearing Officer resulting from a fair hearing concluded on March 8, 2006 for ______. This hearing was held in accordance with the provisions found in the Common Chapters Manual, Chapter 700 of the West Virginia Department of Health and Human Resources. This fair hearing was convened on March 8, 2006 on a timely appeal, filed September 28, 2005. It should be noted that this hearing was originally scheduled for January 18, 2006. The hearing was rescheduled to March 8, 2006 at the request of the claimant.


It should be noted here that the claimant's benefits have been denied.

II. PROGRAM PURPOSE:

The Program entitled Aged/Disabled Home and Community-Based Services Waiver (ADW) is set up cooperatively between the Federal and State governments and administered by the West Virginia Department of Health & Human Resources.

The Aged/Disabled Home and Community-Based Services Waiver (ADW) Program is defined as a long-term care alternative which enables the individual to remain at or return home rather than receiving nursing facility (NF) care. The program provides eligible individuals with a range of services comparable to those services provided in a nursing facility. Specifically, ADW program services include assistance with personal hygiene, nutritional services which include food preparation and feeding, arrangement for medical and nursing care, medication administration, and environmental maintenance necessary for clients to remain in their homes.

IV. QUESTIONS TO BE DECIDED:

The question(s) to be decided is whether the claimant meets the medical requirements needed to receive ADW services.

V. APPLICABLE POLICY:

Sections 570, 570.1, 570.1.a, and 570.1.b of the Medicaid Aged & Disabled Waiver Program Policies & Procedures Manual

VII. FINDINGS OF FACT:

- 1) The claimant applied for ADW services.
- 2) A medical assessment was completed on 09/08/2005. Three deficits were found. The deficits found were physically unable to vacate in the event of emergency, physical assistance with bathing and grooming. (D-2)

- 3) The claimant was notified of potential denial in a letter dated 09/12/2005. (D-3) A final denial letter was issued 09/26/2005. (D-4) The claimant requested a hearing on this issue.
- 4) Testimony from the claimant revealed that she disagreed with one finding the one on dressing. Ms. **Stated** that during the day of the assessment the claimant was asked if she could dress herself and the claimant had stated "yes". This is documented on the PAS-2000. (D-2) Ms. _____ went on to testify that she could still dress herself.
- 5) Section 570 of the Medicaid Aged & Disabled Waiver Program Policies & Procedures Manual effective November 1, 2003 reads in part:

Applicants for the ADW Program must meet all of the following criteria to be eligible for the program:

- A. Be 18 years of age or older.
- B. Be a permanent resident of West Virginia.
- C. Be approved as medically eligible for NF Level of Care.
- D. Meet the Medicaid Waiver financially eligibility criteria for the program as determined by the county DHHR office, or the SSA if an active SSI recipient.
- E. Choose to participate in the ADW Program as an alternative to NF care.
- 6) Section 570.1 of the Medicaid Aged & Disabled Waiver Program Policies & Procedures Manual effective November 1, 2003 reads:

A QIO under contract to BMS determines medical eligibility for the A/D Waiver Program.

 Section 570.1.a of the Medicaid Aged & Disabled Waiver Program Policies & Procedures Manual effective November 1, 2003 reads:

The purpose of the medical eligibility review is to ensure the following:

- A. New applicants and existing clients are medically eligible based on current and accurate evaluations.
- B. Each applicant/client determined to be medically eligible for ADW services receives an appropriate level of care (LOC) that reflects current/actual medical condition and short- and long-term service needs.
- C. The medical eligibility determination process is fair, equitable, and consistently applied throughout the state.
- 8) Section 570.1.b of the Medicaid Aged & Disabled Waiver Program Policies & Procedures Manual effective November 1, 2003 reads:

An individual must have five deficits on the PAS to qualify medically for the ADW Program. These deficits are derived from a combination of the following assessment elements on the PAS:

- A. #24: Decubitus Stage 3 or 4
- B. #25 In the event of an emergency, the individual is c) mentally unable or d) physically unable to vacate a building. a) and b) are not considered deficits.
- C. #26: Functional abilities of individual in the home:

Eating - Level 2 or higher (physical assistance to get nourishment, not preparation) Bathing - Level 2 or higher (physical assistance or more) Grooming - Level 2 or higher (physical assistance or more) Dressing - Level 2 or higher (physical assistance or more) Continence - Level 3 or higher (must be incontinent) Orientation - Level 3 or higher (totally disoriented, comatose) Transfer - Level 3 or higher (one person or two persons assist in the home) Walking - Level 3 or higher (one person assist in the home) Wheeling - Level 3 or higher (must be Level 3 or 4 on walking in the home to use Level 3 or 4 for wheeling in the home. Do not count outside the home.)

- D. #27: Individual has skilled needs in one or more of these areas (g) suctioning,(h) tracheostomy, (i) ventilator, (k) parenteral fluids, (l) sterile dressings, or(m) irrigations.
- E. #28: Individual is not capable of administering his/her own medications.

VIII. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW:

- 1) An individual must have five deficits on the PAS-2000 to qualify medically for the ADW Program. These deficits are determined from a combination of elements on the PAS-2000.
- 2) Three deficits were established at the time of the PAS review on 09/08/05. Those were physically unable to vacate in the event of an emergency and needs physical assistance with bathing and grooming.
- 3) Testimony received from the claimant does not clearly demonstrate any changes to the conclusions reached by the Department.
- 4) There are a total of three deficits.

IX. DECISION:

It is the finding of the State Hearing Officer that the claimant does not meet the medical criteria for the ADW Program. The Department is upheld in the decision to deny the claimant's benefits under the Aged/Disabled Home and Community-Based Services Waiver (ADW) Program.
