#### **DECISION OF STATE HEARING OFFICER**

#### **INTRODUCTION**

This is the decision of the State Hearing Officer resulting from a fair hearing for This hearing was held in accordance with the provisions found in Chapter 700 of the West Virginia Department of Health and Human Resources' Common Chapters Manual. This fair hearing was convened on January 21, 2015, on an appeal filed November 18, 2014.

The matter before the Hearing Officer arises from the November 5, 2014, decision by the Respondent to reduce the Claimant's homemaker hours under the Aged/Disabled Waiver program from a Level D to a Level C.

At the hearing, the Respondent appeared by Tamra Grueser, RN, with the Bureau of Senior Services. Appearing as a witness for the Respondent was RN, with the West Virginia Medical Institute. The Claimant appeared *pro se*. 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After a review of the record, including testimony, exhibits, and stipulations admitted into evidence at the hearing, and after assessing the credibility of all witnesses and weighing the evidence in consideration of the same, the Hearing Officer sets forth the following Findings of Fact.

#### FINDINGS OF FACT

1)	On October 29, 2014, the Claimant was evaluated to determine continued medical eligibility for the Aged/Disabled Waiver (ADW) Program. West Virginia Medical Institute (WVMI) Nurse completed a Pre-Admission Screening (PAS) (D-2) form with Claimant to assess her functional abilities in the home. Nurse assessed the Claimant with twenty-five (25) level-of-care points based on the information derived from the medical evaluation.

- On November 5, 2014, the Respondent issued notice (D-5) to the Claimant of its decision to reduce her ADW homemaker hours from Level D to Level C as a result of the assessment by Nurse

  Twenty-six (26) points (D-1) are required for the Claimant to continue receiving services at a Level D care.
- The Claimant's witnesses contested the Claimant not receiving an additional point in the area of bathing. The Claimant's daughter and homemaker, testified that she bathes her mother completely. At times the Claimant will attempt to wash her face or head, but Ms. stated she has to wash those areas again. Ms. stated most of the time, the Claimant will hold a washcloth over her eyes during bathing and that is the extent of her participation in the activity.
- 4) the Claimant's case manager, was present during the October 2014 medical evaluation and contended that although the Claimant reported to Nurse that she could assist in her bathing, Ms. corrected her mother and reported that the Claimant required total care in the area.

#### APPLICABLE POLICY

Aged/Disabled Home and Community-Based Services Waiver Policy Manual Sections 501.5.1.1(a) and 501.5.1.1(b) (D-1) set forth the Service Level criteria. There are four (4) Service Levels for Personal Assistance/Homemaker services, and points are determined based on the following sections of the PAS:

- #23 Medical Conditions/Symptoms- 1 point for each (can have total of 12 points)
- #24 Decubitus- 1 point
- #25 1 point for b, c, or d
- #26 Functional abilities: Level 1 - 0 points

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Level 2 - 1 point for each item a through i

Level 3 - 2 points for each item a. through m; i (walking) must be equal to or greater than Level 3 before points are given for j (wheeling)

Level 4 - 1 point for a, 1 point for e, 1 point for f, 2 points for g through m

- #27 Professional and Technical Care Needs 1 point for continuous oxygen
- #28 Medication Administration 1 point for b or c
- #34 Dementia 1 point if Alzheimer's or other dementia
- #35 Prognosis 1 point if terminal

The total number of points allowable is 44.

#### LEVELS OF CARE SERVICE LIMITS

Level A - 5 points to 9 points - 0-62 hours per month

Level B - 10 points to 17 points - 63-93 hours per month

Level C - 18 points to 25 points - 94-124 hours per month

Level D - 26 points to 44 points - 125-155 hours per month

### **DISCUSSION**

The Claimant was assessed as a Level 2 – physical assistance – in the area of bathing based on her disclosure to the assessing nurse that she was able to wash certain areas of her body. The Claimant's witnesses provided testimony that the Claimant does not participate in bathing, and requires total care in the area. While the documentation found in the October 2014 PAS indicated that the Claimant participates in bathing, credible testimony from the Claimant's witnesses held that the Claimant overestimates her abilities and does not assist in her bathing. This information was made available to the assessing nurse at the time of the medical evaluation, and the Claimant will be awarded one (1) additional point in the area of bathing.

#### **CONCLUSIONS OF LAW**

Whereas the Claimant was found to require total care in the area of bathing, one (1) additional point will be added to the Claimant's level-of-care determination. The Claimant continues to meet the medical criteria for Level D care.

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# **DECISION**

It is the decision of the State Hearing Officer to **reverse** the decision of the Department to reduce the Claimant's homemaker hours under the Aged/Disabled Waiver program from a Level D to a Level C care.
