

Using the Interpreter List

The listing that follows are interpreters who have some level of national certification or are qualified interpreters. If a level or certification is not listed for an individual, then according to our records, that individual has not been nationally certified.

The first column is by the county and state where the interpreter resides. The second is the contact information. The third column identifies the level of certification or screening the interpreter currently holds. The fourth column is for pertinent information regarding education, training, and experience. It is important to recognize that specialties are identified by the interpreter and are not to be construed as an endorsement of his/her qualifications in those settings by the West Virginia Commission for the Deaf and Hard of Hearing. The fifth column provides information regarding specific training the interpreter has completed either through coursework or intensive workshops.

It is recommended that you agree to billing terms prior to the assignment when hiring an interpreter. If you are unsure of the level of skill needed for a particular assignment, please contact the WVCDHH staff for advice.
