

### **In-Person Professional Development Policies**

The following policies and procedures will remain in effect for all training sessions conducted at Choices CCR&R Offices until further notice:

### Apprenticeship for Child Development

ACDS now offers both in-person and virtual classes. If participants live in a region that offers an in-person class, they are expected to attend that session. Priority for virtual classes will go to regions that do not have an in-person option due to circumstances such as not having an instructor, or not having enough students to hold a class. Please note that the registration process has recently changed. There is now a deadline to register each semester. The registration deadline date will vary each semester, but will be two weeks prior to classes beginning. For more information regarding classes, including the latest class schedule and registration deadline, please visit the ACDS website, wvacds.org and the ACDS Facebook page. Below are steps to follow when registering for ACDS classes.

#### HOW TO REGISTER FOR ACDS CLASSES

- All students must complete an online orientation for the semester they want to attend. The orientations are available on the WV STARS website, www.wvstars.org. Students can be either on the WV STARS pathway or registry. The orientations can be found on the training calendar by searching self-paced courses. The registration form is now included within the orientations. There is no need to submit a separate paper registration form to ACDS. The orientation must be completed before the registration deadline.
- 2. All students must submit the \$25.00 registration fee directly to ACDS. ACDS accepts business, personal and bank drafted checks and money orders made payable to River Valley Child Development Services (RVCDS). ACDS now accepts debit and credit card payments. To pay using a card visit the ACDS website for a credit card submission form. We CANNOT accept payments over the telephone because the credit card submission form must be signed by the card holder. All forms of payments should be accompanied by the payment submission form also located on the ACDS website. Completing this form helps ensure that your payment will be credited accurately and timely. Payment must be received by the registration deadline.

\* Failure to complete the full registration process will result in the applicant not being enrolled.

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### Food and Fun

#### **Alphabet Sand Dig**

Materials: Play sand, shells, permanent marker, shovels, spoons or scoops

Directions: Write letters of the alphabet on the backs of your shells with permanent marker. (You can start with uppercase and provide extensions off this type of play by adding lowercase later.) Pour the sand in your sand table or sensory bin. Bury the shells in the sand. Allow children to use shovels, spoons, or scoops to find the shells.



#### **Fresh Fruit Popsicle**

Materials: 1 cup grape juice, 3/4 cup fresh cut fruit (strawberries, blueberries, kiwi, etc.), 1 tablespoon sugar, popsicle molds or small Dixie cups with wooden popsicle sticks

Directions: Adults make sure fruit is finely cut and prepared. Next fill the popsicle molds up first with the fruit of your choice. Mix together the sugar and grape juice and pour over the fruit. Insert the sticks into the molds and place in the freezer for at least 2-3 hours or until completely frozen.

#### **Bear Hunt S'mores Trail Mix**

Materials: Teddy Graham crackers, marshmallows, pretzels, chocolate chips, small sandwich bags

Directions: Act out "Going on a Bear Hunt" story or song. Expand this story by making Bear Hunt trail mix. Let children measure out For more Food & Fun ideas, Teddy Grahams, marshmallows, pretzels, and chocolate chips to mix into their own individual sand- Ashley.N.Jobes@wv.gov wich bags, then pack up for your next "bear hunt" and enjoy!



#### **Play Dough Bug Fossils**

Materials: play dough, plastic insects, magnifying glass, tweezers or tongs, rolling pin and/or other play dough tools

Directions: First, roll out playdough flat onto a hard surface or tray. Next, press different insect into the play dough to make fossil looking prints, and remove using tweezers or tongs. Lastly, use the magnifying glass to examine the prints left behind.
