The Child Care Reimbursement System is a quality initiative that offers higher subsidy payments to programs that demonstrate they meet higher standards of care. Programs may apply for Tier II if specific higher quality standards are met. These providers receive a higher childcare reimbursement rate and are eligible for additional bonus payments.

The Advantages of having a Breastfeeding Friendly Child Care Designation:

- 1. Designation shows the community your commitment to quality care.
- 2. Child and Adult Care Feeding Program (CACFP) meal reimbursements are available when mothers breastfeed at the center or provide breastmilk for feeding their infant.
- 3. Designation can positively affect staff recruitment and retention as well as productivity and morale.
- 4. Sites achieving designation receive a bonus stipend, certificate of designation and recognition, and materials for start up.

ABOUT ACDS

ACDS is a four semester apprenticeship program for individuals working directly with children birth to age 12 for a minimum of 20 hours a week. Classes are one evening a week for 15 weeks a semester. Virtual classes are available for counties that do not offer an in-person option.

PARTICIPATION

Registration for the fall term starts June 1 and for the spring term November 1 each year. Interested participants should follow the outlined steps to register for class each term.

In-Person Professional Development Policies

- Children are not permitted to attend training sessions.
- Participants who arrive more than 15 minutes late will not receive WV STARS credit.
- Training sessions may be cancelled due to low enrollment or weather.

Online Professional Development Policies

- You must register for each training in WV STARS and on the registration links provided.
- Each participant must individually register and log in to the training to receive credit. Device/screen sharing is not permitted for WV STARS credit.
- Participants who call in to the training by phone without also logging in to a computer, smartphone, or tablet will not receive credit, as this type of attendance cannot be tracked.



Car Wash Sensory Bin

Materials: 2-sided sensory bin, play cars and trucks, mud, soapy water (use tear free soap), scrub brushes, sponges, and wash cloths.

Instructions: Start by hiding, burying, and driving several toy cars into the mud. Give children a scrubby brush, sponge, or wash cloth and let them play carwash.



Bug Hotel

Materials: A large plastic bottle or jug, string to hang, paper rolls, sticks, twigs, pinecones, bark, leaves, pieces of moss, and other small nature items.

Instructions: Cut your bottle to the desired size. You can make one large bug hotel or several small ones. Gather and sort all your pieces. Place the pieces inside the container so that everything feels snug and secure. Depending on the size of the container you may need a lot of materials. When you are finished, place the bug hotel in a place where children can return to observe it. You can hang them on trees or on a fence. Bring out magnifying glasses for children so they can check if their bug hotel has any visitors.





Watermelon Pizza

Materials: Watermelon cut into triangles, 1 quart of yogurt, various cut up fruit, child safe butter knife.

Instructions: Give each child a watermelon triangle. With the butter knife allow children to cover their watermelon slices with yogurt. Let them choose their fruit toppings to add on top of the yogurt and enjoy!
