# Winter Healthy Tips



Food and Fun

This time of year, we often see lots of stuffy noses, achy ears, and barking coughs. Although cold and flu season often coincides with winter and frigid temperatures, the cold does not cause infections and viruses. Instead, the increased time inside together is what leads to the spread of these illnesses. So what can you do to help minimize the impact of this on your programs?

One of the most effective strategies for preventing the spread of germs is well executed hand washing. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention provides guidance about when and how to wash your and children's hands.

- 1. Wet your hands with clean running water then apply soap.
- 2. Lather your hands by rubbing them together. Lather the backs of your hands, between your fingers, and under your nails.
- 3. Scrub your hands for at least 20 seconds. For an easy timer, try singing "Happy Birthday" from start to finish two times!
- 4. Rinse your hands under clean, running water.
- 5. Dry your hands using a clean towel or air dryer.

The WV Child Care Credential is an initiative from the Division of Early Care and Education to recognize outstanding professionalism within the child care field. Applying for this recognition involves creating a professional portfolio highlighting professional development, beliefs, and work experience. A \$500 bonus payment and recognition certificate will be provided after the General credential is awarded.

Once the General credential is achieved, providers can apply for one Specialization credential that best represents their early childhood career. Currently, the Director, Preschool, Infant/Toddler, and Family Child Care Specializations are available. A \$250 bonus payment and recognition certificate will be provided after a Specialization is awarded.

- 1. Designation shows the community your commitment to quality care.
- 2. Child and Adult Care Feeding Program (CACFP) meal reimbursements are available when mothers breastfeed at the center or provide breastmilk for feeding their infant.
- 3. Designation can positively affect staff recruitment and retention as well as productivity and morale.
- 4. Sites achieving designation receive a bonus stipend, certificate of designation and recognition, and materials for start up.

#### **ABOUT ACDS**

ACDS is a four semester apprenticeship program for individuals working directly with children birth to age 12 for a minimum of 20 hours a week. Classes are one evening a week for 15 weeks a semester. Virtual classes are available for counties that do not offer an in-person option.

#### **PARTICIPATION**

Registration for the fall term starts June 1 and for the spring term November 1 each year. Interested participants should follow the outlined steps to register for class each term.

Visit the WV STARS training calendar and search self-paced courses for all ACDS orientations.



STEP TWO

Complete registration that is linked at the end of each orientation.



STEP THREE

### Food and Fun

### **Two-Ingredient Snow Dough**

*Materials*: Baking soda, water in a spray bottle, glitter (optional)

Instructions: Pour baking soda into a large mixing bowl and alternate spraying it with water while mixing it until consistency is reached. Add glitter if desired. When it's ready, the snow dough will still be very loose and fluffy but will easily come together into a ball when you squeeze it in your hands.



### **Ice Painting**

Materials: Shallow plastic bin, paintbrushes and tools, watercolor or finger paint, ice cubes or a bag of ice

Instructions: Dump ice cubes or a bag of ice into a bin. Give children different paint brushes or textured paint tools. Allow children to paint the ice. As the ice seems to get covered in paint, move the ice from the bottom to the top of the bin to continue painting.



#### Bread in a Bag

Materials: 1 gallon sized resealable plastic bag, 3 cups flour, 1/4 cup sugar, 1 packet yeast, 1 cup warm water, 1/4 cup melted butter, 1 teaspoon salt

Instructions:

- Combine 1 cup of flour, sugar, and yeast packet in a bowl. Pour into a resealable bag.
- Add warm water. Seal bag, pressing out air.
- Begin shaking and mixing the bag by hand.
- Allow bag to rest for 10 minutes (proofing).
- In a bowl, combine 1 cup

of flour with salt. Add it and butter to the bag.

- Seal bag again, pressing out air. Shake and mix again.
- Open bag and add in the last cup of flour.
- Seal bag and mix for final time.
- Take out dough and place on a floured surface.
- With floured hands, knead dough for 5-10 minutes.
- Place dough in a greased loaf pan.
- Lay towel over the loaf pan and set it in a warm spot. Allow the dough 30-45 minutes to rise.
- Bake at 375 for 25 minutes.
