Attached is a copy of the findings of fact and conclusions of law on your hearing held June 9, 2006. Your hearing request was based on the Department of Health and Human Resources' proposal to close your Aged and Disabled Waiver case.

In arriving at a decision, the State Hearings Officer is governed by the Public Welfare Laws of West Virginia and the rules and regulations established by the Department of Health and Human Resources. These same laws and regulations are used in all cases to assure that all persons are treated alike.

Eligibility for the Aged and Disabled Waiver Services Program is based on current policy and regulations. Some of these regulations state as follows: Applicants for the ADW Program must meet all of the following criteria to be eligible for the program:

- A. Be 18 years of age or older.
- B. Be a permanent resident of West Virginia. The individual may be deinstitutionalized from a NF in any county of the state, or in another state, as long as his permanent residence is in West Virginia.
- C. Be approved as medically eligible for NF Level of Care.
- D. Meet the Medicaid Waiver financial eligibility criteria for the program as determined by the county DHHR office, or the SSA if an active SSI recipient.
- E. Choose to participate in the ADW Program as an alternative to NF care. Even if an individual is medically and financially eligible, a waiver allocation must be available for him/her to participate in the program. (WV Provider Manual Chapter 570 PROGRAM ELIGIBILITY FOR CLIENT).

The information submitted at your hearing revealed: You meet the medical eligibility criteria for continued Waiver Services.

It is the decision of the State Hearings Officer to REVERSE the PROPOSAL of the Department to close the Aged and Disabled Waiver case.

	DECISION OF THE STATE HEARING OFFICER
I.	INTRODUCTION:
	This is a report of the State Hearing Officer resulting from a fair hearing concluded on August 1, 2006 for Ms This hearing was held in accordance with the provisions found in the Common Chapters Manual, Chapter 700 of the West Virginia Department of Health and Human Resources. This fair hearing was scheduled for June 9, 2006 on a timely appeal filed March 15, 2006.
	It should be noted here that Ms was receiving benefits at the time of the hearing. A pre-hearing conference was not held between the parties, and Ms did not have legal representation.
II.	PROGRAM PURPOSE:
	The Program entitled Aged and Disabled Waiver Services is set up cooperatively between the Federal and State governments and administered by the West Virginia Department of Health & Human Resources.
	Under Section 2176 of the Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act of 1981, states were allowed to request a waiver from the Health Care Financing Administration (HCFA) so that they could use Medicaid (Title XIX) funds for home and community-based services. The program's target population is individuals who would otherwise be placed in an intermediate or skilled nursing facility (if not for the waiver services). Services offered under the Waiver Program will include: (1) chore, (2) homemaker and (3) case management services. West Virginia has been

offering the Waiver Services Program since July, 1982 to those financially eligible individuals who have been determined to need ICF level care but who have chosen the Waiver Program

Services as opposed to being institutionalized.

VII.	FINDINGS OF FACT:	
	This issue involves the denial of continued services under the Aged and Disabled Waiver Services Program. The re-evaluation assessment was completed on January 10, 2006, for Ms The primary diagnosis was listed as Hydrocephalus; Chronic Headache; and Major Depression. Those present during the assessment were Ms. Homemaker; Ms; and Ms, RN of the West Virginia Medical Institute (Exhibit D-2).	

	required deficits to continue Waiver Services. The deficits were in the areas of: Bathing; Grooming; and Dressing. It should be noted that the evaluation was based only on Ms.
	2) The West Virginia Medical Institute issued a Potential Denial Letter to Ms.  on February 9, 2006 (Exhibit D-4). According to the letter, Ms had deficiencies in 3 areas: Bathing; Grooming; and Dressing. Ms was given two
	weeks to provide any additional medical documentation for reconsideration.
	3) Ms did not submit additional documentation for review, in a timely manner. The information was received on March 13, 2006 and not reviewed by WVMI (Exhibit D-6). On February 27, 2006 (Exhibit D-3), the WVMI issued a Termination/Denial Letter.
	4) Ms requested a fair hearing, and it was received by the Bureau for Medical Services on March 15, 2006 (Exhibit D-5).
	At the hearing, Ms. Kay Ikerd, RN reviewed the ADW Policy (Exhibit D-1). A new policy went into effect November 1, 2005 that addressed how certain areas of the PAS would be evaluated. At the request of Ms, Ms. Ikerd and Ms further explained the definition of Orientation. According to Ms the individuals are evaluated upon person, place and time.
	6) Ms. RN reviewed the PAS assessed on January 10, 2006 (Exhibit D-2). There were no questions from the participants.
	7) The areas of dispute were: Eating; Continence of Bladder; Walking; Vacating a Building; and Medication Administration.

	Vacating - A person is physically unable at all times at Level 3 or higher in walking or mentally incapable of leaving the building at Level 3 or higher in orientation with a diagnosis of dementia, Alzheimers, or related condition. Ms.  received a Level 2 in walking

Ms. determined through her evaluation that Ms. \_\_\_\_\_ only had three of the five

and Level 1 in orientation. In addition, Ms. \_\_\_\_\_\_ did not have a diagnosis of dementia, Alzheimers, or a related condition. A deficit will not be awarded in this area.

- 8) The additional deficits awarded for Eating and Bladder Incontinence will increase the total deficits to five. Ms. \_\_\_\_\_\_ remains eligible for the Aged and Disabled Waiver program.
  - 9) Aged/Disabled Home and Community Based Services Manual § 570 PROGRAM ELIGIBILITY FOR CLIENT:

Applicants for the ADW Program must meet all of the following criteria to be eligible for the program:

- A. Be 18 years of age or older.
- B. Be a permanent resident of West Virginia. The individual may be deinstitutionalized from a NF in any county of the state, or in another state, as long as his permanent residence is in West Virginia.
- C. Be approved as medically eligible for NF Level of Care.

**10**) Aged/Disabled Home and Community Based Services Manual § 570.1.a. - Purpose:

The purpose of the medical eligibility review is to ensure the following:

- A. New applicants and existing clients are medically eligible based on current and accurate evaluations.
- B. Each applicant/client determined to be medically eligible for ADW services receives an appropriate LOC that reflects current/actual medical condition and short and long-term service needs.
- C. The medical eligibility determination process is fair, equitable, and consistently applied throughout the State.
- **11**) Aged/Disabled Home and Community Based Services Manual § 570.1.b. Medical Criteria:

An individual must have five deficits on the PAS 2005 to qualify medically for the ADW Program. These deficits are derived from a combination of the following assessment elements on the PAS:

- A. Decubitus Stage 3 or 4 (Item 24 on PAS 2005)
- B. Unable to vacate a building a person is physically unable at all times at Level 3 or higher in walking or mentally incapable of leaving the building at Level 3 or higher in orientation with a diagnosis of dementia, Alzheimers, or related condition. (Item 25, I and 33, on the PAS 2005).

C. Functional abilities of individual in the home. (Item 25 on the PAS 2005).

Eating - Level 2 or higher (physical assistance to get nourishment, not preparation)

Bathing - Level 2 or higher (physical assistance or more)

Grooming - Level 2 or higher (physical assistance or more)

Dressing - Level 2 or higher (physical assistance or more)

Continence - Level 3 or higher (must be total incontinent – defined as when the recipient has no control of bowel or bladder functions at any time.)

Orientation - Level 3 or higher (totally disoriented, comatose)

Transfer - Level 3 or higher (one person or two persons assist in the home)

Walking - Level 3 or higher (one person assist in the home)

Wheeling - Level 3 or higher (must be Level 3 or 4 on walking in the home to use Level 3 or 4 for wheeling in the home. Do not count outside the home.)

- D. Individual has skilled needs in one or more of these areas (g) suctioning, (h) tracheostomy, (i) ventilator, (k) parenteral fluids, (l) sterile dressings, or (m) irrigations. (Item 26 on the PAS 2005)
- E. Individual is not capable of administering his/her own medications is defined as an individual not capable of administering his/her own medications if the prescription medication must be placed in the recipient's hand, mouth, tube, or eye by some one other than the recipient at all times.

### VIII. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW:

The Aged/Disabled Home and Community Based Services Manual § 570.1.b. - Medical Criteria states in part, "An individual must have five deficits on the PAS to qualify medically for the ADW Program."

The testimony and medical documentation indicates Ms	was awarded additional
deficits for Eating and Bladder Incontinence. This will increase the	total deficits to five
Ms remains eligible for continued services under the Ag	ed and Disabled Waiver
Program.
