Attached is a copy of the findings of fact and conclusions of law on your hearing held June 26, 2007. Your hearing request was based on the Department of Health and Human Resources' proposal to terminate your services under the Aged and Disabled Waiver Services Program.

In arriving at a decision, the State Hearings Officer is governed by the Public Welfare Laws of West Virginia and the rules and regulations established by the Department of Health and Human Resources. These same laws and regulations are used in all cases to assure that all persons are treated alike.

Eligibility for the Aged and Disabled Waiver Services Program is based on current policy and regulations. Some of these regulations state as follows:

Applicants for the ADW Program must meet all of the following criteria to be eligible for the program:

- Be 18 years of age or older. Α.
- В. Be a permanent resident of West Virginia. The individual may be deinstitutionalized from a NF in any county of the state, or in another state, as long as his permanent residence is in West Virginia.
- C. Be approved as medically eligible for NF Level of Care.
- D. Meet the Medicaid Waiver financial eligibility criteria for the program as determined by the county DHHR office or the Social Security Administration (SSA) if an active SSI (Supplemental Security Income) recipient.
- E. Choose to participate in the ADW Program as an alternative to NF care.

Even if an individual is medically and financially eligible, a waiver allocation must be available for him/her to participate in the program. (WV Provider Manual Chapter 503 MEMBER ELIGIBILITY AND ENROLLMENT PROCESS).

The information submitted at your hearing revealed: You do not meet the medical eligibility criteria for continued coverage under the Aged and Disabled Waiver Services Program.

It is the decision of the State Hearings Officer to **uphold** the **proposal** of the Department to terminate your services.

DECISION OF STATE HEARING OFFICER

I. INTRODUCTION:

This is a report of the State Hearing Officer resulting from a fair hearing concluded on July 3, 2007 for ______. This hearing was held in accordance with the provisions found in the Common Chapters Manual, Chapter 700 of the West Virginia Department of Health and Human Resources. This fair hearing was convened on June 26, 2007 on a timely appeal filed May 1, 2007.

It should be noted here that the Claimant was receiving benefits under the Aged and Disabled Waiver Services Program, and she was not represented by Counsel. A pre-hearing conference was not held between the parties prior to the hearing.

II. PROGRAM PURPOSE:

The Program entitled Aged and Disabled Waiver Services Program is set up cooperatively between the Federal and State governments and administered by the West Virginia Department of Health & Human Resources.

Under Section 2176 of the Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act of 1981, states were allowed to request a waiver from the Health Care Financing Administration (HCFA) so that they could use Medicaid (Title XIX) funds for home and community-based services. The program's target population is individuals who would otherwise be placed in an intermediate or skilled nursing facility (if not for the waiver services). Services offered under the Waiver Program will include: (1) chore, (2) homemaker and (3) case management services. West Virginia has been offering the Waiver Services Program since July, 1982 to those financially eligible individuals who have been determined to need ICF level care but who have chosen the Waiver Program Services as opposed to being institutionalized.

III. PARTICIPANTS:

Presiding at the Hearing was, Ray B. Woods, Jr., M.L.S., State Hearing Officer and a member of the State Board of Review.

IV. QUESTIONS TO BE DECIDED:

The question(s) to be decided is: Does ______ continue to meet the medical eligibility criteria for the Aged and Disabled Waiver Program?

VII. FINDINGS OF FACT:

- 1) This issue involves the proposed denial of continued services under the Aged and Disabled Waiver Services Program.
- 2) The assessment (PAS) was completed on March 28, 2007. Those present during the assessment were the Claimant; Homemaker; CWVAS RN; and the WVMI RN (Exhibit D-2).

- The WVMI RN determined through her evaluation that the Claimant only had four (4) of the five required deficits for Waiver Services. The deficits were in the areas of: Physically unable to vacate the building; Bathing; Grooming; and Dressing. It should be noted that the evaluation was based only on the Claimant's functional levels on the day of the visit.
- 4) A Potential Denial Letter was issued to the Claimant on April 4, 2007 (Exhibit D-3). The letter allowed the Claimant to submit additional medical information within the next 2 weeks.
- 5) The Claimant did not submit additional medical information.
- 6) A Termination Letter was issued to the Claimant on April 20, 2007 (Exhibit D-4). The letter stated in part, "An evaluation of your current medical condition indicates that you are not entitled to services under the A/D Waiver Program."
- 7) At the hearing, the BoSS LSW explained the policy (Exhibit D-1). There were no questions from the participants.
- 8) The WVMI RN reviewed her overall comments on the PAS dated March 28, 2007.
- 9) The areas of dispute were Bladder and Bowel Incontinence; Pain; and Arthritis.
- 10) Pain and Arthritis are not eligible for deficits under the ADW Policy.
- 11) The Claimant and CWVAS RN did not dispute the WVMI RN's testimony and remarks for Bladder and Bowel Incontinence, at the time of the March 28, 2007 evaluation or during the hearing.
- 12) No points will be awarded for Bladder and Bowel Incontinence.
- 13) 503 MEMBER ELIGIBILITY AND ENROLLMENT PROCESS (Exhibit D-1):

Applicants for the ADW Program must meet all of the following criteria to be eligible for the program:

- A. Be 18 years of age or older.
- B. Be a permanent resident of West Virginia. The individual may be deinstitutionalized from a NF in any county of the state, or in another state, as long as his permanent residence is in West Virginia.
- C. Be approved as medically eligible for NF Level of Care.
- D. Meet the Medicaid Waiver financial eligibility criteria for the program as determined by the county DHHR office, or the Social Security Administration (SSA) if an active SSI (Supplemental Security Income) recipient.
- E. Choose to participate in the ADW Program as an alternative to NF care.

Even if an individual is medically and financially eligible, a waiver allocation must be available for him/her to participate in the program.

14) 503.1 MEDICAL ELIGIBILITY (Exhibit D-1):

A QIO (WVMI) under contract to BMS determines medical eligibility for the ADW Program.

15) 503.1.1 PURPOSE (Exhibit D-1):

The purpose of the medical eligibility review is to ensure the following:

- A. New applicants and existing members are medically eligible based on current and accurate evaluations.
- B. Each applicant/member determined to be medically eligible for ADW services receives an appropriate LOC that reflects current/actual medical condition and short- and long-term service needs.
- C. The medical eligibility determination process is fair, equitable, and consistently applied throughout the State.

16) 503.2 MEDICAL CRITERIA (Exhibit D-1):

An individual must have five (5) deficits on the Pre-Admission Screening Form (PAS), to qualify medically for the ADW Program. These deficits are derived from a combination of the following assessment elements on the PAS.

Section #24	Description of Deficits Decubitus; Stage 3 or 4
#25	In the event of an emergency, the individual is c) mentally unable or d) physically unable to vacate a building. a) Independently and b) With Supervision are not considered deficits.
#26	Functional abilities of individual in the home
a.	Eating Level 2 or higher (physical assistance to get nourishment, not preparation)
b.	Bathing Level 2 or higher (physical assistance or more)
c.	Dressing Level 2 or higher (physical assistance or more)
d.	Grooming Level 2 or higher (physical assistance or more)
e.	Continence, bowel Level 3 or higher; must be incontinent.
f.	Continence, bladder Level 3 or higher; must be incontinent.
g.	Orientation Level 3 or higher (totally disoriented, comatose).
h.	Transfer Level 3 or higher (one-person or two-person assistance in the home)
i.	Walking Level 3 or higher (one-person assistance in the home)
j.	Wheeling Level 3 or higher (must be Level 3 or 4 on walking in the home to use Level 3 or 4 for wheeling in the home. Do not count outside

#27 Individual has skilled needs in one or more of these areas: (g) suctioning, (h) tracheostomy, (i) ventilator, (k) parenteral fluids, (l) sterile dressings, or (m) irrigations.

#28 Individual is not capable of administering his/her own medications.

VIII. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW:

- 1) The March 28, 2007 PAS was based on the Claimant's functional levels on the day of the BoSS RN's visit.
- 2) An individual must have five (5) deficits on the Pre-Admission Screening Form (PAS), to qualify medically for the ADW Program.
- 3) The Claimant has a total of four (4) deficits in the areas of: Vacating the building; Bathing; Grooming; and Dressing.
- 4) The testimony and medical documentation does not support additional deficits.
- 5) The Claimant does not qualify medically for continued services under the ADW Program.

IX. DECISION:

It is the decision of this State Hearing Officer to uphold the proposal of the Department to terminate services under the Aged and Disabled Waiver Services Program.
