

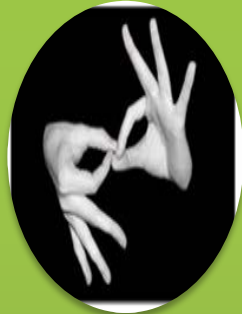
Activities WVCDHH is Required/Allowed to Do by Law



Information

- **Maintain information about:**
 - Education
 - Communication (including interpreters)
 - Group home facilities
 - Independent living skills
 - Recreational facilities
 - Employment
 - Vocational training
 - Health and mental health services
 - Substance abuse
 - Other services necessary to assure their ability to function in society

Required



Interpreters

- **Provide these services related to interpreters:**
 - Maintain list (including ASL teachers)
 - Registry
 - Evaluation

Outreach

- **Familiarize the public with deaf and hard of hearing:**
 - Rights
 - Needs
 - Services

Required



Investigate

- **Investigate the condition of deaf and hard of hearing West Virginians, especially:**
 - Aged
 - Homeless
 - Needy
 - Victims of rubella
 - Victims of abuse or neglect
 - Group home needs
 - Services for multidisabled deaf and hard of hearing

Required



Training

- **MAY establish workshops for teaching:**
 - Interpretive skills
 - In-service training
 - Counseling for the deaf and hard of hearing
