  - Communication (including interpreters)
  - Group home facilities
  - Independent living skills
  - Recreational facilities
  - Employment
  - Vocational training
  - Health and mental health services
  - Substance abuse
  - Other services necessary to assure their ability to function in society

## Interpreters

- Provide these services related to interpreters:
  - Maintain list (including ASL teachers)

- Familiarize the public with deaf and hard of hearing:
  - Rights
  - Needs
  - Services



## Investigate

- Investigatethe condition of deaf and hard of hearing West Virginians, especially:
  - Aged
  - Homeless
  - Needy
  - Victims of rubella
  - Victims of abuse or neglect
  - Group home needs
  - Services for multidisabled deaf and hard of hearing



# Training

- MAY establish workshops for teaching:
  - Interpretive skills
  - In-service training
  - Counseling for the deaf and hard of hearing
