



ASSISTIVE TECHNOLOGY CLINICS

Children, families and their WV Birth to Three (WVBTT) teams are invited to apply for a half-day assistive technology clinic.

Space is limited and participants will be selected for each clinic location. At least one WVBTT Individualized Family Service Plan (IFSP) team member must attend with the child and family. WVBTT contact hours available.

What Happens at the Clinic?

Selected families will rotate through hands-on labs where specialists will provide screenings, demonstrate assistive technology tools, and offer recommendations that may support the child's participation in everyday routines.

Labs include:

- Mobility & Motor
- Communication
- Daily Living Skills
- Vision

Participants will have opportunities to explore, try, and learn about assistive technology that may support the child at home and in daily routines. In-home trials may be set up in conjunction with the WVBTT team and National Seating and Mobility as appropriate.

Who Should Apply?

Children enrolled in WVBTT with the following:

- Complex developmental needs/complex medical background with neurological impact (motor delays and/or communication delays, delays in vision and/or hearing)
- Possible Cortical Visual Impairments (CVI) characteristics

How to Apply?

Applications should be completed by a member of the child's team in collaboration with the family.
