Windy Fall Leaves Sensory Bottle

1. Peel off sticker. Use Goo Gone to remove sticky residue.
2. Empty and/or drink water in Voss bottle.
3. Add 10-20 fall leaves. We used mostly red and yellow with a few green leaves.
4. Fill the Voss bottle with 75% Corn Syrup.
5. Sprinkle in a few shakes of gold glitter. (Start with a small amount, you can always add more later.)
6. Fill the bottle up the rest of the way with water. You want to fill it all the way to the top so there is no air in it.
7. Place lid on the bottle and shake it up. (It will be a bit clumpy and murky for a few hours until the contents mix and settle.)

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This is such an easy and adorable craft for kids to do this fall. My 8 year old and my 2 year old loved doing these! My 2 year old was not able to cut the pumpkin out herself so I had to help with that, but she loved doing the handprint on the pumpkin!

Not only is this a great craft for kids, it's also a cute keepsake for parents. I used orange construction paper and cut it into the shape of a pumpkin. I then cut out a small rectangular piece of green construction paper for the stem. We used Elmer's glue to glue the stem on the pumpkin (you could use tape if you don't have glue). Then we just used regular white paper and I used a paint sponge to paint the kids' hands so that they could put their prints on the paper. We used their index fingerprint for the stem. We cut around their handprints in a circle shape and glued the circles onto the pumpkin like it shows in the picture. I had my oldest daughter to write her name on her pumpkin along with the year. I hope your family enjoys this activity!

What is Birth to Three?

WV Birth to Three is a statewide system of resources and supports for children under age three who have a delay in their development, or may be at risk of having a delay, and their family. The Department of Health and Human Resources, through the Bureau for Public Health and the Office of Maternal, Child and Family Health, WV Birth to Three, as the lead agency for Part C of the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA), assures that family centered, community based services are available to all eligible children and families.

How do I make a referral?

To refer a child to the WV Birth to Three system in state, complete the WVBTT Referral Form and forward to the office that services the child's location or you may call 1-866-321-4728

"It is important to remember that each child develops differently and in his or her own way. "

Who is eligible?

An infant or toddler under the age of three can either have a delay in one or more areas of their development, or be at risk of possibly having delays in the future. A child may have delays in one or more of the following areas:

- **Cognitive - thinking and learning**
- **Physical - moving, seeing and hearing**
- **Social/emotional - feeling, coping, getting along with others**
- **Adaptive - doing things for him/herself**
- **Communication - understanding and communicating with others**

A child may have risk factors such as: A condition which is typically associated with a developmental delay such as Down Syndrome; or a combination of biological and other risk factors. Some of these factors may include family stressors.
