Training Registration for Professionals

You will have to register for all training sessions through the WVSTARS website – https://wvregistry.org/ets/store/calendar/. WV Birth to Three (WVBTT) has a 2-step process for registering a Webinar. <u>Step 2</u> – Return to the information about the training and click on agenda. There you will find the link to the webinar where you can register and have access to the materials for that session.
