Attached is a copy of the findings of fact and conclusions of law on your administrative disqualification hearing held March 1, 2006.

In arriving at a decision, the State Hearings Officer is governed by the Public Welfare Laws of West Virginia and the rules and regulations established by the Department of Health and Human Resources. These same laws and regulations are used in all cases to assure that all persons are treated alike.

For the purpose of determining, through an administrative disqualification hearing, whether or not a person has committed an intentional program violation, the following criteria will be used: Intentional program violation shall consist of having (1) made a false or misleading statement or misrepresented, concealed, or withheld facts or (2) committed any act that constitutes a violation of the Food Stamp Act, the Food Stamp regulations, or any statute relating to the use, presentation, transfer, acquisition, receipt, or possession of Food Stamp coupons (Section B. Appendix A Chapter 700 of Common Chapters Manual). Individuals found to have committed an intentional program violation shall be ineligible to participate in the Food Stamp Program for a fixed period of time as explained in section 20.2(c)(2) and 9.1 (A)(2)(g) of the WV Income Maintenance Manual and 7 CFR Section 273.16.

The information which was submitted at your hearing revealed that you withheld the fact that you were a convicted drug felon during an application for Food Stamps taken on March 18, 2005 which caused an over issuance of Food Stamps in the amount of \$511 for the period of March 23 through June, 2005.

It is the decision of the State Hearings Officer that you <u>committed</u> an Intentional Program Violation of the Food Stamp Program and you will be individually disqualified from participation in the Food Stamp Program for a period of one (1) year beginning April, 2006.

DECISION OF STATE HEARING OFFICER

I. INTRODUCTION:

This is a report of the State Hearing Officer resulting from an administrative disqualification hearing concluded on March 1, 2006 for ______. This hearing was held in accordance with the provisions found in the Common Chapters Manual, Chapter 700 of the West Virginia Department of Health and Human Resources. It should be noted that the defendant did not attend the hearing but the hearing was convened in her absence as an appointment letter was sent by certified mail on January 18, 2006 notifying her of the date, time, and location of the hearing and the defendant signed the return receipt on January 30, 2006.

II. PROGRAM PURPOSE:

The Program entitled Food Stamp Program is set up cooperatively between the Federal and State governments and administered by the West Virginia Department of Health & Human Resources.

The purpose of the Food Stamp Program is to provide an effective means of utilizing the nation's abundance of food "to safeguard the health and well-being of the nation's population and raise levels of nutrition among low-income households.". This is accomplished through the issuance of EBT benefits to households who meet the eligibility criteria established by the Food and Nutrition Service of the U.S. Department of Agriculture

III. PARTICIPANTS:

1. Debbie Roberts, Repayment Investigator.

Presiding at the Hearing was Thomas M. Smith, State Hearing Officer and a member of the State Board of Review.

IV. QUESTIONS TO BE DECIDED:

The question to be decided is whether it was shown by clear and convincing evidence that the defendant, _____, committed an intentional program violation of the Food Stamp Program.

V. APPLICABLE POLICY:

WV Income Maintenance Manual Section 1.2, 9.1, 20.2. Federal Food Stamp Regulations Sections 273.11, 273.16. Common Chapters Manual Section 700, Appendix A.

VII. FINDINGS OF FACT:

- 1) The Investigations and Fraud Management (IFM) Unit received a referral that the defendant failed to report that she was a convicted drug felon causing an over issuance of Food Stamps.
- 2) The defendant completed an application for the Food Stamp Program on 3-18-05 and did not report that she was a convicted drug felon (Exhibits #DHS-5 and #DHS-6).
- 3) The defendant reported during a phone call on 8-10-05 that she could not obtain employment because she had a drug felony (Exhibit #DHS-9) which caused her to be ineligible for Food Stamps from March 23 through June, 2005 and caused a Food Stamp over issuance of \$511 (Exhibit #DHS-3).

- 4) The defendant had two (2) opportunities to report that she was a convicted drug felon as she answered "no" to the question on the application taken on 3-18-05 on page 3 which asked if the individual was a convicted drug felon (Exhibit #DHS-5) and marked "yes" to statement #8 on the Rights and Responsibilities signed by her on 3-18-05 (Exhibit #DHS-6) which informs the applicant that a conviction for possession, use or distribution of a controlled substance causes permanent disqualification.
- The defendant completed and signed the application/review form on 3-18-05 and signed the rights and responsibilities acknowledging her understanding of her reporting requirements and the penalties for intentional program violation (Exhibits #DHS-5 & #DHS-6).
- 6) According to Common Chapters Manual, Chapter 700, Appendix A, Section B, an intentional program violation consists of having intentionally made a false statement, or misrepresented, concealed or withheld facts, or committed any act that constitutes a violation of the Food Stamp Act, the Food Stamp Program Regulations, or any statute relating to the use, presentation, transfer, acquisition, receipt or possession of food stamp coupons.
- 7) WV Income Maintenance Manual Section 20.2, C, 2 states that once an IPV is established, a disqualification penalty is imposed on the AG member(s) who committed the IPV. See Section 9.1, A, 2, g.
- 8) WV Income Maintenance Manual Section 9.1, A, 2, g states that persons who have been found guilty of an IPV are ineligible as follows: 1st offense: 1 year, 2nd offense: 2 years, 3rd offense: permanent.

VIII. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW:

Common Chapters Section 700, Appendix A defines an intentional program violation as having intentionally made a false statement or concealed or withheld facts. The defendant concealed and withheld information about her drug felony conviction when she applied for Food Stamps and read the Rights and Responsibilities on 3-18-05. The defendant reported on 8-10-05 that she had a drug felony conviction but failed to report the information when she applied for Food Stamps on 3-18-05. The evidence shows that the defendant committed an intentional program violation which caused a Food Stamp over issuance of \$511 for the period of March 23 through June, 2005.

IX. DECISION:

It is the decision of the State Hearing Officer that the defendant committed an intentional program violation of the Food Stamp Program and she will be individually disqualified from participation in the Food Stamp Program for a period of one (1) year beginning April, 2006.
