Attached is a copy of the findings of fact and conclusions of law on your administrative disqualification hearing held May 5, 2006.

In arriving at a decision, the State Hearings Officer is governed by the Public Welfare Laws of West Virginia and the rules and regulations established by the Department of Health and Human Resources. These same laws and regulations are used in all cases to assure that all persons are treated alike.

For the purpose of determining, through an administrative disqualification hearing, whether or not a person has committed an intentional program violation, the following criteria will be used: Intentional program violation shall consist of having (1) made a false or misleading statement or misrepresented, concealed, or withheld facts or (2) committed any act that constitutes a violation of the Food Stamp Act, the Food Stamp regulations, or any statute relating to the use, presentation, transfer, acquisition, receipt, or possession of Food Stamp coupons (Section B. Appendix A Chapter 700 of Common Chapters Manual) Individuals found to have committed an intentional program violation shall be ineligible to participate in the Food Stamp Program for a fixed period of time as explained in section 20.2(c)(2) and 9.1 (A)(2)(g) of the WV Income Maintenance Manual and 7 CFR Section 273.16.

The information which was submitted at your hearing revealed that you committed an intentional program violation of the Food Stamp Program by concealing information about the employment and earned income of your husband, ______, from the state of which caused an overissuance of Food Stamps in the amount of \$549 for the period of May 16, 2005 through June, 2005.

It is the decision of the State Hearings Officer that you <u>committed</u> an Intentional Program Violation of the Food Stamp Program and you will be individually disqualified from participation in the Food Stamp Program for a period of one (1) year beginning June, 2006.

DECISION OF STATE HEARING OFFICER

I. INTRODUCTION:

This is a report of the State Hearing Officer resulting from an administrative disqualification hearing concluded on May 5, 2006 for ______. This hearing was held in accordance with the provisions found in the Common Chapters Manual, Chapter 700 of the West Virginia Department of Health and Human Resources. It should be noted that the defendant did not attend the hearing but the hearing was convened in her absence as an appointment letter was sent by regular mail on April 5, 2006 notifying her of the date, time, and location of the hearing and the defendant had an active Food Stamp case at the time the hearing was scheduled. It should also be noted that the hearing was originally scheduled for March 6 and April 11, 2006 but was rescheduled initially due to an incorrect address and then at Department's request. It should also be noted that the hearing was convened by speaker phone after the claimant failed to appear.

II. PROGRAM PURPOSE:

The Program entitled Food Stamp Program is set up cooperatively between the Federal and State governments and administered by the West Virginia Department of Health & Human Resources.

The purpose of the Food Stamp Program is to provide an effective means of utilizing the nation's abundance of food "to safeguard the health and well-being of the nation's population and raise levels of nutrition among low-income households.". This is accomplished through the issuance of EBT benefits to households who meet the eligibility criteria established by the Food and Nutrition Service of the U.S. Department of Agriculture

III. PARTICIPANTS:

1. Debbie Roberts, Repayment Investigator.

Presiding at the Hearing was Thomas M. Smith, State Hearing Officer and a member of the State Board of Review.

IV. QUESTIONS TO BE DECIDED:

The question to be decided is whether it was shown by clear and convincing evidence that the defendant, _____, committed an intentional program violation of the Food Stamp Program.

WV Income Maintenance Manual Section 1.2, 9.1, 10.3, 10.4, 20.2. Federal Food Stamp Regulations Sections 273.9, 273.16. Common Chapters Manual Section 700, Appendix A.

VII. FINDINGS OF FACT:

1) The Investigations and Fraud Management (IFM) Unit received a referral that the defendant failed to report total household income at the time of application on 5-16-05 causing an overissuance of Food Stamps.

- 2) Defendant's husband, ______, started working at the start of 5-16-05 (Exhibit #DHS-10), the date the defendant applied for Food Stamps but the defendant did not report that her husband was employed. (Exhibit #DHS-6).
- 3) A Food Stamp overissuance occurred for the period of May 15, 2005 through June, 2005 in the amount of \$549 due to the unreported earned income.
- 4) The defendant had an opportunity to report the employment and earned income on 5-16-05 when she completed an application for the Food Stamp Program (Exhibit #DHS-6) and on 5-19-05 when she called the local office to report the Social Security number for her son (Exhibit #DHS-9).
- 5) The defendant completed an application/review form on 5-16-05 (Exhibit #DHS-6) and signed the rights and responsibilities acknowledging her understanding of her reporting requirements and the penalties for intentional program violation (Exhibit #DHS-7).
- 6) According to Common Chapters Manual, Chapter 700, Appendix A, Section B, an intentional program violation consists of having intentionally made a false statement, or misrepresented, concealed or withheld facts, or committed any act that constitutes a violation of the Food Stamp Act, the Food Stamp Program Regulations, or any statute relating to the use, presentation, transfer, acquisition, receipt or possession of food stamp coupons.
- 7) WV Income Maintenance Manual Section 20.2, C, 2 states that once an IPV is established, a disqualification penalty is imposed on the AG member(s) who committed the IPV. See Section 9.1, A, 2, g.
- 8) WV Income Maintenance Manual Section 9.1, A, 2, g states that persons who have been found guilty of an IPV are ineligible as follows: 1st offense: 1 year, 2nd offense: 2 years, 3rd offense: permanent.

VIII. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW:

Common Chapters Section 700, Appendix A defines an intentional program violation as having intentionally made a false statement or concealed or withheld facts. The defendant concealed and withheld information about the employment and earned income of benefit group member and husband, ______, from the food stamp on May 16, 2005 when she completed an application for the Food Stamp

Program. The defendant acted with intent and committed an intentional program violation which caused a Food Stamp overissuance of \$549 for the period of May 16, 2005 through June, 2005.

IX. DECISION:

It is the decision of the State Hearing Officer that the defendant committed an intentional program violation of the Food Stamp Program and she will be individually disqualified from

participation in the Food Stamp Program for a period of one (1) year beginning June, 2006.
