Dear Ms. \_\_\_\_\_:

Attached is a copy of the findings of fact and conclusions of law on your hearing held February 3, 2006. Your hearing request was based on the Department of Health and Human Resources' proposal to terminate your benefits and services under the Medicaid, Aged/Disabled Title XIX (Home & Community-Based) Waiver Program.

In arriving at a decision, the State Hearing Officer is governed by the Public Welfare Laws of West Virginia and the rules and regulations established by the Department of Health and Human Resources. These same laws and regulations are used in all cases to assure that all persons are treated alike.

The Aged /Disabled (HCB) Title XIX Waiver Services Program is granted to those individuals who continue to meet all eligibility requirements. One of these requirements is that the individual must qualify medically. Eligible individuals are those who qualify medically for a nursing facility level of care but have chosen the Waiver Program as a means to remain in their home. [Aged/Disabled (HCB) Services Manual 570-570.1b (11/1/03)].

The information which was submitted at your hearing revealed that your medical condition continues to require a sufficient number of services and the degree of care required to medically qualify you for the Aged/Disabled Home & Community Based Services Waiver Program.

It is the decision of the State Hearing Officer to **reverse** the proposal of the Department to terminate your benefits and services under the Aged/Disabled Title XIX (HCB) Waiver Program.

**DECISION OF STATE HEARING OFFICER**

**I. INTRODUCTION:**

This is a report of the State Hearing Officer resulting from a fair hearing concluded on March 8, 2006 for \_\_\_\_\_. This hearing was held in accordance with the provisions found in the Common Chapters Manual, Chapter 700 of the West Virginia Department of Health and Human Resources. This fair hearing was convened on February 3, 2006 on a timely appeal, filed October 12, 2005.

It should be noted here that the Claimant's benefits under the Medicaid Title XIX Waiver (HCB) Program have continued pending a hearing decision.

**II. PROGRAM PURPOSE:**

The Program entitled Medicaid Title XIX Waiver (HCB) is set up cooperatively between the Federal and State governments and administered by the West Virginia Department of Health & Human Resources.

Under Section 2176 of the Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act of 1981, states were allowed to request a waiver from the Health Care Financing Administration (HCFA) so that they could use Medicaid (Title XIX) funds for home and community-based services. The program's target population is individuals who would otherwise be placed in an intermediate or skilled nursing facility (if not for the waiver services).

Services offered under the Waiver Program will include: (1) chore, (2) homemaker and (3) case management services. West Virginia has been offering the Waiver Services Program since July, 1982 to those financially eligible individuals who have been determined to need ICF level care but who have chosen the Waiver Program Services as opposed to being institutionalized.

Presiding at the Hearing was Thomas E. Arnett, State Hearing Officer and a member of the State Board of Review.

### **IV. QUESTIONS TO BE DECIDED:**

The question to be decided is whether the Claimant continues to be medically eligible for services under the Aged/Disabled Waiver (HCB) Program.

### **VII. FINDINGS OF FACT:**

- 1) On July 8, 2005, the Claimant was reevaluated (medically assessed) by West Virginia Medical Institute (WVMi) to verify continued medical eligibility for participation in the Aged & Disabled Waiver Services Program, hereinafter ADW.
- 2) The PAS-2000 (exhibit D-2) completed by WVMi determined that the Claimant is no longer medically eligible to participate in the ADW Program, and on August 16, 2005, a notice of Potential Denial (exhibit D-3), was sent to the Claimant. This notice states, in pertinent part:

To be eligible for benefits you must be deficient in at least 5 of 13 critical areas as mandated in the Medicaid Program Regulations. Based on your PAS you have deficiencies in only 4 areas – Vacate a Building, Bathing, Grooming and Dressing.

Since your PAS did not indicate the required deficits, your request for benefits cannot be approved.

Additional medical documentation was submitted for review in accordance with the provisions allowed in this notice. This information has been identified as exhibit D-3a.

- 3) The additional medical documentation, according to WVMI, failed to identify any additional functional deficits and on October 4, 2005, WVMI notified the Claimant via a termination/denial notice (exhibit D-4) that eligibility for participation in the ADW Program could not be established. This notice includes some of the following pertinent information:

Your request for benefits under the Home and Community Based Aged/Disabled Waiver Program has been terminated/denied.

An evaluation of your current medical condition indicates that you are not entitled to services under the AD Waiver Program. A decision has been made to terminate / deny your homemaker and case management services.

Eligibility for the Aged/Disabled Waiver program requires deficits in at least 5 of the health areas below. Your PAS (Pre-Admission Screening Form) indicated deficiencies in 4 areas – Vacate a building, Bathing, Grooming and Dressing.

- 4) The Claimant's ability to administer medications was assessed by WVMI at the level of "prompting and supervision," and according to policy, this level does not qualify as a functional deficit. Information received at the hearing confirms that the Claimant's medication containers are set-up by her daughter to alleviate confusion, and while this information alone is consistent with prompting and supervision, credible testimony received at the hearing reveals that there have been several occasions when medications that should have been taken were found on the floor. Based on this evidence, the Claimant's need for assistance in medication administration clearly exceeds the level of prompting and supervision. The Claimant cannot administer her own medications and a deficit is therefore awarded in this area.
- 5) Aged/Disabled Home and Community Based Services Manual § 570 – Program Eligibility for Client:

Applicants for the ADW Program must meet all of the following criteria to be eligible for the Program:

- C. Be approved as medically eligible for NF level of care.

6) Aged/Disabled Home and Community Based Services Manual § 570.1.a. - Purpose:

The purpose of the medical eligibility review is to ensure the following:

- A. New applicants and existing clients are medically eligible based on current and accurate evaluations.
- B. Each applicant/client determined to be medically eligible for ADW services receives an appropriate LOC that reflects current/actual medical condition and short and long-term service needs.
- C. The medical eligibility determination process is fair, equitable, and consistently applied throughout the State.

7) Aged/Disabled Home and Community Based Services Manual § 570.1.b. - Medical Criteria:

An individual must have five (5) deficits on the PAS to qualify medically for the ADW Program. These deficits are derived from a combination of the following assessment elements on the PAS:

- A. # 24: Decubitus - Stage 3 or 4
- B. #25: In the event of an emergency, the individual is c) mentally unable or d) physically unable to vacate a building. a) and b) are not considered deficits.
- C. #26: Functional abilities of individual in the home.

Eating----- Level 2 or higher (physical assistance to get nourishment, not preparation)

Bathing ----- Level 2 or higher (physical assistance or more)

Grooming -----Level 2 or higher (physical assistance or more)

Dressing ----- Level 2 or higher (physical assistance or more)

Continence --- Level 3 or higher (must be incontinent)

Orientation---- Level 3 or higher (totally disoriented, comatose)

Transfer-----Level 3 or higher (one person or two person assist in the home)

Walking ----- Level 3 or higher (one person or two person assist in the home)

Wheeling ----- Level 3 or higher (must be Level 3 or 4 on walking in the home to use Level 3 or 4 for wheeling in the home Do not count outside the home)

- D. #27: Individual has skilled needs in one or more of these areas – (g) suctioning, (h) tracheostomy, (i) ventilator, (k) parenteral fluids, (l) sterile dressings, or (m) irrigations.
- E. #28: The individual is not (c) capable of administering his/her own medications.

**VIII. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW:**

- 1) A medical assessment was completed on the Claimant to determine continued medical eligibility for participation in the Aged/Disabled Waiver Program on July 8, 2005.
- 2) Medical eligibility for the Aged/Disabled Waiver program requires deficits in at least five (5) specific categories of nursing services.
- 3) The medical assessment completed by WVMi reveals that the Claimant demonstrated four (4) program qualifying deficits – Vacating a building, Bathing, Grooming and Dressing.
- 4) The evidence submitted on behalf of the Claimant establishes one (1) additional deficit in medication administration.
- 5) Whereas the Claimant exhibited 5-deficits in the specific categories of nursing services, continued medical eligibility for the Aged & Disabled Waiver Services Program is therefore established.

**IX. DECISION:**

It is the decision of the State Hearing Officer to **reverse** the proposal of the Agency to terminate your benefits and services under the Aged/Disabled Title XIX (HCB) Waiver Program.
