	DECISION OF STATE HEARING OFFICER	
I.	INTRODUCTION:	
	This is a report of the State Hearing Officer resulting from a Fair Hearing concluded on February 29, 2012 for This hearing was held in accordance with the provisions found in the Common Chapters Manual, Chapter 700 of the West Virginia Department of Health and Human Resources. This Fair Hearing was convened by telephone conference call on February 28, 2012, on a timely appeal filed December 5, 2011.)
II.	PROGRAM PURPOSE:	
	The Program entitled Aged and Disabled Waiver (ADW) is administered by the Wes Virginia Department of Health & Human Resources.	t
	The ADW Program is defined as a long-term care alternative that provides services which enable an individual to remain at or return home rather than receiving nursing facility (NF) care. Specifically, ADW services include Homemaker, Case Management Consumer-Directed Case Management, Medical Adult Day Care, Transportation, and RN Assessment and Review.	,
III.	PARTICIPANTS:

Presiding at the hearing was Stephen M. Baisden, State Hearing Examiner and a member of the Board of Review.

The Hearing Examiner placed all participants under oath at the beginning of the hearing.

IV. QUESTIONS TO BE DECIDED:

The question to be decided is whether or not the Department was correct in the decision to reduce Claimant's homemaker hours from a Level "C" to a Level "B."

V. APPLICABLE POLICY:

Aged and Disabled Home and Community Based Waiver Policy Manual, chapter 501.5.1.1(a) and chapter 501.5.1.1(b).

VII. FINDINGS OF FACT:

1) Department's representative entered into the record the applicable policy for this hearing. (Exhibit D-1.) Aged and Disabled Home and Community Based Waiver Policy Manual Chapter 501.5.1.1(a) and 501.5.1.1(b) states:

There will be four levels of care for clients of ADW homemaker services. Points will be determined based on the following sections of the PAS:

- #23- Medical Conditions/Symptoms 1 point for each (can have total of 12 points)
- #24- Decubitis- 1 point
- #25- 1 point for b., c., or d.
- #26- Functional abilities

Level 1-0 points

Level 2- 1 point for each item a. through i.

Level 3- 2 points for each item a. through m.; i. (walking) must be equal to or greater than Level 3 before points are given for j. (wheeling)

Level 4 - 1 point for a., 1 point for e., 1 point for f., 2 points for g. through m.

- #27- Professional and Technical Care Needs- 1 point for continuous oxygen
- #28- Medication Administration- 1 point for b. or c.
- #34- Dementia- 1 point if Alzheimer's or other dementia
- #35- Prognosis- 1 point if terminal

Total number of points possible is 44.

LEVELS OF CARE SERVICE LIMITS

Level A- 5 points to 9 points; 2 hours per day or 62 hours per month

Level B- 10 points to 17 points; 3 hours per day or 93 hours per month

Level C- 18 points to 25 points; 4 hours per day or 124 hours per month

Level D- 26 points to 44 points; 5 hours per day or 155 hours per month

Aged and Disabled Home and Community Based Waiver Policy Manual Chapter 501.5.1.3 states in part:

Nurses shall not render medical diagnoses. In those cases where there is a medical diagnosis question, the decision shall be based on medical evidence presented by appropriate medical professionals.

- 2) Department's witness testified that she conducted a Pre-Admission Screening (PAS) for the Aged and Disabled Waiver Services (ADW) program with Claimant on November 15, 2011. (Exhibit D-3.) Claimant was awarded a total of 17 points on the PAS and was approved for Level B of care. WVMI reported its findings to Claimant in a Notice of Decision dated November 21, 2011. (Exhibit D-4.)
- 3) Department's witness testified that Claimant should have received one more point on her PAS. She testified that Claimant should have received this additional point on item #23, Medical Conditions/Symptoms, (h) pain. She stated that although she did not have a physician's diagnosis for this medical condition, she noted Claimant had medications specifically for pain. Department's witness added that she could not determine if a technical problem had occurred with her computer or if she made a typographical error, but the Level-of-Care point that she intended to award for the medical condition of pain did not appear on the final print-out of the PAS. (Exhibit D-3.) Department's representative did not dispute that an additional Level-of-Care point should have been assessed for #23, (h) pain.

VIII. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW:

- 1) Policy dictates that an individual's level of care for the Aged and Disabled Waiver Program is determined by the number of points obtained on the PAS assessment tool. The Claimant was awarded 17 points as the result of a PAS completed by WVMI in November 2011. This places Claimant at a level of care of "B." In order to receive a level of care of "C," Claimant needs at least 18 points on the PAS.
- 2) Department's witness testified that Claimant should have been awarded an additional point for the medical diagnoses of pain. Department's representative did not object to the awarding of this additional point.
- 3) Since one additional point will be added to Claimant's PAS evaluation score, it will increase to 18 points. She meets the medical criteria required to receive a Level C of care.

IX. DECISION:

It is the decision of the State Hearing Officer to **reverse** the decision of the Department to reduce Claimant's level of care under the Aged and Disabled Waiver Program from Level "C" to Level "B".
