Attached is a copy of the findings of fact and conclusions of law on your hearing held June 18, 2003. Your hearing request was based on the Department of Health and Human Resources' action to, decrease the amount of your Food Stamps and, require a spenddown for the Medicaid Program.

In arriving at a decision, the State Hearing Officer is governed by the Public Welfare Laws of West Virginia and the rules and regulations established by the Department of Health and Human Resources. These same laws and regulations are used in all cases to assure that all persons are treated alike.

Eligibility and benefit levels for Food Stamps and SSI-Related Medicaid are determined based on current regulations. One of these regulations specifies that,

"Unearned income from Annuity Payments is counted for Food stamps and SSI-Related Medicaid." (West Virginia Income Maintenance Manual 10.3 J ANNUITY PAYMENTS).

The information submitted at the hearing revealed: You were given all disregards and deductions for the Food Stamp and Medicaid Programs.

It is the decision of the State Hearing Officer, to uphold the action of the Department to (1) Decrease the amount of the Food Stamps and; (2) Require a spenddown for Medicaid Benefits based on the income from the annuity payments.

## SUMMARY AND DECISION OF THE STATE HEARING OFFICER

#### I. INTRODUCTION

This is a report of the State Hearing Officer resulting from a fair hearing concluded on January 26, 2005, for Ms.

This hearing was held in accordance with the provisions found in the Common Chapters Manual, Chapter 700 of the West Virginia Department of Health and Human Resources. This fair hearing was originally scheduled on June 18, 2004, on a timely appeal filed May 10, 2004.

It should be noted here that, Ms. \_\_\_\_\_'s Food Stamp Benefits were decreased prior to the fair hearing.

All persons giving testimony were placed under oath. A pre-hearing conference was not held between the parties.

#### II. PROGRAM PURPOSE

The programs entitled Food Stamps and SSI-Related Medical Assistance Only are set up cooperatively between the Federal and State Government and administered by the West Virginia Department of Health and Human Resources.

The purpose of the Food Stamp Program is to provide an effective means of utilizing the nation's abundance of food "to safeguard the health and well-being of the nation's population and raise levels of nutrition among low-income households". This is accomplished through the issuance of food coupons to households who meet the eligibility criteria established by the Food and Nutrition Service of the U.S. Department of Agriculture.

SSI Related Medicaid is a segment of the Medicaid Program available to individuals who meet the requirement of categorical relatedness by qualifying as either aged, disabled, or blind as those terms are defined by the Social Security Administration for purposes of eligibility for SSI.

## IV. QUESTION(S) TO BE DECIDED

Did the Department properly determine that Ms. \_\_\_\_\_'s Food Stamp Benefits should be deceased and; Secondly, Is it necessary for Ms. \_\_\_\_\_ to meet a spenddown for Medicaid Benefits?

## VII. FINDINGS OF FACT

- Mr. Bragg provided the following Hearing Summary:

"\_\_\_\_\_\_ case #\_\_\_\_\_ has requested a fair hearing based on the decrease in her food stamps and the creation of a spenddown for her Medicaid case. The client was initially approved for foods stamps based on zero income that she had indicated at the interview. Pended client for a copy of her divorce decree and when it was received, it indicated that in the divorce she receives the annuity from the death of her son and that she has life estate in the former marital residence and that she is to make the mortgage payment of the home.

Client's food stamps then decreased from \$141.00 monthly to \$96.00 monthly and giving the food stamp case credit for the \$733.76 mortgage payment. The annuity if \$723.00. This has also caused the Medicaid to have a spenddown of \$3,018.00 for a six month period."

- Ms. \_\_\_\_\_ disputed the testimony of Mr. Bragg. She did not provide a copy of the Divorce Decree for review.

- The decision was given at the conclusion of the fair hearing.

## VIII. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- West Virginia Income Maintenance Manual 10.3 J ANNUITY PAYMENTS states in part,

"Unearned income from Annuity Payments is counted for Food stamps and SSI-Related Medicaid."

- WVIMM Section 10.4 B INCOME DISREGARDS AND DEDUCTIONS states in part,

"The following is the only allowable disregards and deductions for the Food Stamp Program: Earned Income Disregard; Standard Deduction; Dependent Care Deduction; Child Support Deduction; Homeless Shelter Standard Deduction; Medical Expenses and; Shelter/Utility Deduction."

### IX. DECISION

Ms. \_\_\_\_\_ did not provide any legal documents stating she did not receive a monthly annuity payment. Mr. Bragg gave Ms. \_\_\_\_\_ all allowable deductions and disregards for the Food Stamp Program. The unearned income from the annuity requires Ms. \_\_\_\_\_ to meet a spenddown to be eligible for SSI-Related Medicaid Benefits.

It is the decision of this State Hearing Officer, to uphold the action of the Department to (1) Decrease the amount of the Food Stamps and; (2) Require a spenddown for Medicaid Benefits based on the income from the annuity payments.
